RENEWAL TERMS

The expectation from OEO is that all authorized charter schools achieve a high level of performance as measured by the standards in the Academic, Financial and Organizational frameworks. Within those frameworks a school earns one point for each standard met or partially met each year of the contract term with the exception of the last year during contract renewal. If there are multiple data points within a standard the one point is divided equally among those data points. To calculate the overall percentage for each individual framework and determine the baseline renewal term length, the number of points earned is divided by the number of possible points across all years of the contract term except the final year. A school receiving an overall percentage of at least 75% in each framework will automatically be recommended by the OEO for a five-year renewal term.

OEO recognizes that school may not reach the 75% threshold in each framework. In such instances, the school will receive a baseline recommendation for renewal term determined by the overall lowest percentage received in any of the performance frameworks. In those instances, it will be the responsibility of the school throughout the renewal process to explain the reasons for not meeting the threshold and the specific strategies, which will or are being implemented to mitigate those challenges in the future. The Director may share the data with the Advisory Committee to consider, along with feedback received during a potential site visit, in making a recommendation for the renewal term. This Advisory Committee's recommendation will be forwarded to the Director who will review the recommendation and consult with UW System stakeholders as needed to make a recommendation to the UW System President and Board of Regents. All recommendations will be based upon the Academic, Financial and Organizational frameworks set forth herein. The table below details the baseline contract renewal term lengths determined by the Performance Framework:
